Building Bridges!

Class 2 has been diving deep into our history topic exploring famous Victorians and their remarkable contributions to the world. Our pupils have been particularly fascinated by Isambard Kingdom Brunel and his extraordinary engineering achievements. They spent time investigating the spectacular Clifton Suspension Bridge - a truly remarkable piece of Victorian innovation.

Pupils embraced a hands-on engineering challenge, constructing bridges using different materials and testing their structural integrity. Their task was to build a bridge capable of supporting a 'train' (cleverly represented by a whiteboard rubber), which sparked incredible problem-solving and creativity.

Class 2 had an incredible morning with Mr Baxter, who introduced them to exciting new skills in frisbee and taekwondo. Mrs Fitton added to the energy by testing the pupils' strength using punch and kick pads - Class 2 demonstrated remarkable strength!






CLASS 3 NEWS

For our new families, we send monthly information on our attendance figures and termly notifications to all parents with updates on your child's individual attendance. Studies show a direct correlation between attendance and academic outcomes, and we will always work with parents to ensure pupils are in school as much as possible. We kindly request that you book medical or dentist appointments outside of school hours whenever possible. If an appointment is unavoidable during the school day, we will need proof of the appointment emailed to the office for our records. The lvy Education Trust has decided to provide two weeks of holiday for half term. We hope you can take advantage of this and avoid any term-time holidays. Please note that no term-time absence will be authorised unless deemed exceptional circumstances.
